Workday, Thursday April 25, 2023—Anyone is welcome!!!

On **Thursday, April 25, 2024**, we will have a workday to do maintenance on the site, including some tree maintenance, improvements to the irrigation system, some trail work, and general preparation for the ceremony on May 4. If you want to participate in the workday, **plan on being at Memorial Grove by 9 am** and bring gloves and appropriate gear for the day. The road directly to Memorial Grove (via Nursery Road) will be open so you don't need to enter through the Fire Center route. There will be plenty of tools available. We usually finish up our work by noon. A map to get you through Monument to the site from I-25 is included below:





Planning Information and Map Memorial Grove Ceremony Saturday---May 4, 2024---10:00 AM to 12 noon Monument Fire Center, Monument, CO

The following is just a bit of information that may be helpful in planning your trip to Memorial Grove:

- The ceremony will start promptly at 10 am and you should allow at least 30-45 minutes to park and get seated at the Memorial. It is a 100-yard walk from the parking area to the site and if needed you can drop off passengers directly at the Memorial site and then return to the parking area.
- There are benches and chairs, but if you want to bring more comfortable folding camp chairs there is plenty of room to use them as well and quite often it is good to have an umbrella.
- During the ceremony there will be a reading of the names of all thirty-seven individuals we are honoring this year. After each name is read, <u>one family member</u> will be provided the opportunity to share a <u>few brief comments</u> about their special honoree on behalf of their entire family.
- We will be serving a light lunch with sandwiches, chips, and soft drinks after the ceremony.
- Please be alert to the weather for the day and dress accordingly...certainly a jacket or coat will likely be a good choice for early May and if it looks like rain, plan accordingly. We do have a tent for rain or for shade.
- There will be restrooms and sanitary wash stations.
- Memorial Grove is located near Monument, CO which is 20 miles north of Colorado Springs and about 50 miles south of Denver, CO on Interstate 25.
- Directions to the site and parking are shown on the attached map and <u>again</u>, <u>please plan to</u>
 arrive at least 30-45 minutes before the ceremony.
- If you want to use GPS to guide you to the site, just enter Nursery Road, Monument, CO and it will bring you to the final few turns to the Memorial Grove...follow the signs!

Memorial Grove Directions

Memorial Grove is located on National Forest System land on what is the historic Monument Tree Nursery and now is the home of the nearby Monument Fire Center. To reach Memorial Grove, follow

From Interstate 25, take Exit 161 and proceed toward Monument to 2nd Street.

Take 2^{nd} Street for one mile across the railroad tracks to the T-junction. (Should be a sign with arrow to left at T-junction)

Turn south or left on Mitchell Avenue and proceed approximately .6 mile to Mt. Herman Rd. (Should be a sign with arrow)

Turn west or right on Mt. Herman Road and then proceed 1.3 miles to Nursery Rd. (Should be a sign with arrow)

Turn south or left onto Nursery Road and proceed 1 mile. Nursery Road turns into Schilling Ave (Should be a sign)

(There is a trailhead parking area on the right side of Nursery Road... this is not the Memorial Grove parking area.)


Continue on to next fork in road with Lindbergh Rd. and go to left on unimproved road through gate to the Memorial Grove parking area down the narrow road. (Should be a sign) ... Parking will be on left and then walk to site, or if needed you can drop folks off directly at the Grove on up road and then return to the parking area.

Remember---The I-25 exit at Monument is #161 and proceed through Monument

If you use a GPS locator, just type in "Nursery Road, Monument, CO" and it will get you close to site!

The ceremony will start promptly at 10 am and you should allow an extra 30-45 minutes to park and get seated at the Memorial site. Traffic on I-25 can be slow on weekends and other events so **please** allow adequate time to get to Monument.
